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10 reasons to take a winter holiday in the Skicircus Saalbach Hinterglemm Leogang Fieberbrunn

In the Alps, there are many beautiful places, family-friendly ski resorts and especially in the Austrian Alps, great food. Still, it is only cool in the Skicircus Saalbach Hinterglemm Leogang Fieberbrunn. What makes the Skicircus so unique?

1. The long name

For those who are not already familiar with the Skicircus Saalbach Hinterglemm Leogang Fieberbrunn, the first thing you will grin about is the long name. However, just as long as the name is, are the list of opportunities in the ski region. The area, which covers two Austrian states, combines 270 kilometres of piste, 70 modern lifts as well as three regions.

2. 3 resorts – 2 states – 1 common denominator

Saalbach Hinterglemm is the liveliest place in the Skicircus. Two town centres with pedestrian zones invite you to take a casual stroll around. Almost every accommodation is located near to a ski lift or alongside the piste. Saalfelden Leogang impresses with its wide range of sporting activities. For those who want a winter holiday without skiing, but a Nordic experience, these family friendly towns are perfect. Just over the border from Salzburger Land, to neighbouring Tyrol, the Skicircus opens to the sporty, friendly town of Fieberbrunn. A wide range of activities awaits families and adventure-seekers in this versatile winter paradise. At the same time, the snow-covered peaks attract freeriders who make their own tracks in the powder snow.

3. 408 kilometres of piste and 121 lifts

With the Ski ALPIN CARD – the combination ticket with the Schmittenhöhe in Zell am See and the Kitzsteinhorn Kaprun – in addition to the extensive skiing area of the Skicircus Saalbach Hinterglemm Leogang Fieberbrunn, you can enjoy stunning views of the Zeller See and fill your lungs with Alpine air on the glacier. A car is not required to enjoy the Skicircus experience. By skiing the Viehhofen piste (168, Zone I), you will reach the valley station of the zellamseeXpress which takes you up to the Schmittenhöhe and back down again.

4. Pleasurable moments in powder snow

When you experience skiing in its most pristine form, taking your first turns early in the morning, gliding over virgin snow, your happy hormones will reach a peak. In the Skicircus these moments are only a gondola ride away, as many routes are not too far away from ultra-modern lifts. Freeriders, who want to earn their turns, can hike to the coolest backcountry spots. Extensive deep-snow slopes and exposed flanks attract even the world's elite to the Freeride World Tour in Fieberbrunn every year.

5. A paradise for children

Who doesn't like to reminisce about a family holiday in the mountains and the first successful turns in the snow, and the happy faces when after the first descent from the mountain top to the valley? In the Skicircus Saalbach Hinterglemm Leogang Fieberbrunn, little ones and mini carvers are introduced in a playful way to the art of skiing with dedicated ski schools. Funslopes, snow trails and family parks provide variety on the slopes, where children forget the day's exertions with feelings of joy. Attractive family packages round off a carefree holiday in the mountains.

6. Alpine lifestyle – the finest mountain cuisine

What is part of a successful day on the slopes? As well as divine panoramic mountain views, a swift ascent to the summit and perfect pistes. The stopover! There are no shortages for stopovers in the Skicircus Saalbach Hinterglemm Leogang Fieberbrunn. Whether it is a rustic 300-year-old Alpine hut, a traditionally furnished cabin, or an exclusive mountain restaurant with the finest cuisine. With a choice of over 60 places to stop for refreshments on the mountains, there is something to suit every taste. If you are searching for peace and quiet and would like to lay back in the sunshine on a deckchair after a hearty lunch, you will find what you are looking for, as will ambitious sports enthusiasts who want to charge their batteries in order to make the most of the day on the piste.

7. State of the Art - Infrastructure at the Highest Level

The Skicircus Saalbach Hinterglemm Leogang Fieberbrunn is continuously undergoing major modernization: numerous new facilities and upgrades have enhanced comfort, efficiency, and skiing fun across all resorts – from state-of-the-art gondolas to expanded offers for families and beginners. These investments underline the region's high standards of quality and make the skiing experience in the Home of Lässig even more diverse.

New, but not brand new: The modernization of the Maiskopf drag lift in Fieberbrunn — transforming it into a 6-seater chairlift — conserves resources while doubling transport capacity from the upcoming winter season, thanks to the reuse of existing components.

A major capacity boost for Fieberbrunn — and a clear statement for sustainability. In Leogang, thrill-seekers can also look forward to an all-new Funslope & Funcross course, opening in 2025..

8. A sporty holiday – Nordic winter

The Skicircus is a diverse winter sports region. The Nordic Park at lake Ritzensee in Saalfelden Leogang is a perfect starting point for all Nordic sports enthusiasts. Here, even the youngest children

learn the basics of cross-country skiing in the Fun & Snow Park. Cross-country skiers will find everything their heart desires. On the natural ice-rink, you can demonstrate your skills as an ice-skating princess or prince. A cross-country skiing holiday in Fieberbrunn, which is also known as the “snow hole” of the Kitzbüheler Alps, results in a top-class sport and nature experience. Fieberbrunn impresses with its perfectly prepared network of cross-country trails with routes of varying difficulty. Whether classic, beginner or professional, here every cross-country skier will find something to suit his/her tastes.

9. The largest ski circuit in the Alps – The Challenge

“Ski your limit” is the slogan that describes one of the most demanding ski circuits of the winter. The statistics speak for themselves: 65 kilometres of downhill runs, 32 lifts, 12,400 metres of altitude difference. The ski circuit in the “Home of Lässig” can be managed by sporty skiers in around 7 hours (breaks not included). Challenge accepted?

With these distances, “The Challenge” ranks at the top of the list of renowned ski circuits in the Alps and even outshines the “Sellaronda”, the “White Ring” or the “King’s Tour”. This challenging ski circuit in the Skicircus will lead you through one of the most versatile and extensive ski areas in Austria. The focus of this challenge is on sporting performance. A lengthy stopover in one of the numerous mountain huts along the route, admiring panoramic views, or taking the chance to sunbathe should be postponed for the next day of skiing. A total of 32 lifts will need to be taken between Saalbach Hinterglemm, Leogang and Fieberbrunn on this ski marathon.

10. Numerous activities aside from the piste

Whether with or without snowshoes, winter hiking in Saalbach Hinterglemm Leogang Fieberbrunn offers the opportunity to enjoy the wintery nature on 140 km of perfectly groomed trails, far away from the hustle and bustle of the ski lifts. Romantic walks, horse-drawn sleigh rides, or excursions over the Golden Gate Bridge of the Alps and the Tree Top Trail bring the winter wonderland to life. Families and sledding fans can enjoy five different toboggan runs, and adventurers can go llama trekking or ride Timok’s Alpine Coaster directly at the middle station Streuböden in Fieberbrunn (included in a valid ski pass). This way, winter off the slopes becomes an unforgettable experience for young and old alike.

New in Winter 2025/26

Skicircus Saalbach Hinterglemm Leogang Fieberbrunn joins the EPIC PASS

Starting this winter season, the Skicircus Saalbach Hinterglemm Leogang Fieberbrunn becomes part of the Epic Pass – the international season ski pass offered by the U.S.-based company Vail Resorts. Through this cooperation, the premium ski area in Salzburg and Tyrol aims to attract more guests from overseas.

The international season ski pass provides access to over 80 ski resorts worldwide – from North America to Japan and Australia. Beginning with the 2025/26 winter season, Epic Pass holders will enjoy five ski days included within the ALPIN CARD network. Conversely, ALPIN CARD season and annual pass holders will receive a 50% discount on the applicable lift ticket rates at 37 North American ski resorts.

F8 Maiskopflift in Fieberbrunn

New, but not brand new: the modernization of the Maiskopf drag lift conserves resources while doubling its transport capacity – thanks to the reuse of existing components.

This upgrade marks a major capacity boost for Fieberbrunn and a strong commitment to sustainability: the old F8 Maiskopf drag lift will be replaced by a six-seater chairlift. The new lift will follow the same route and increase transport capacity from 800 to around 1,800 people per hour. Waiting times on the way back to the valley will thus be a thing of the past – more comfort, more flow in the Skicircus.

What makes this project special: key components from the former Sassgalun lift in Ischgl are being reused for the rebuild. The drive system, towers, and chairs will be repurposed and combined with new elements such as the rope, controls, and modern station buildings. This approach ensures the transformation is not only efficient but also resource-friendly – a flagship project for sustainable mountain lift infrastructure.

Another advantage: by removing the snow-covered drag lift track, the required amount of artificial snow will also be reduced. Starting in the 2025/26 winter season, the Maiskopf will thus offer a well-designed upgrade – functional, comfortable, and future-ready.

New Funslope and Funcross Courses in Leogang

Since 2025, thrill-seekers can look forward to brand-new Funslope and Funcross courses. The Funslope on the Steinberg piste is nearly 400 meters long and nine meters wide, featuring fun elements such as high-fives, waves, and turns for plenty of excitement. The varied Funcross course at the Schanteilift offers dynamic waves, gentle banked turns, and small jumps – perfect for action lovers of all ages.

- Junior XPLORE CARD: The super Saturday ticket for youngsters. For those under the age of 19 (born 2007 – 2019) the ski pass only costs € 15,00 on Saturdays.

- Easter Bonus (28.03. – 06.04.2026): Free ski pass for children (born 2010 and later) on purchase of a parent's ski pass for min. 4 days (except SuperSkiCard).

The Family Card

Parents with toddlers enjoy even more benefits. With our Family Card mum and dad can take turns and share one ski ticket. While one parent is watching the child, the other can set off to enjoy the winter magic – for a once-only partner fee of € 15.00. It's the ultimate symbiosis of kids' pleasure and snow fun: The Family Card: for parents and toddlers age 3 and under. Since the ski pass photo needs to show mother, father and child, all three are required to be present when buying the Family Card. The ticket price is composed of the regular prices according to the price list plus a once-only extra charge of € 15.00. The Family Card can only be purchased directly at the ticket counter and is available for a period of 2 to 8 days.

WE CARE – Sustainability in the Skicircus

Ski tourism & sustainability - that can't work? Very well, we think. Without any 'greenwashing' - honest, transparent and nature-conscious - the Skicircus Saalbach Hinterglemm Leogang Fieberbrunn takes ecological, economic and social measures year after year to make our region greener and healthier in the long term. We are aware of our responsibility for people and nature - sustainability is not an obligation for us, but a matter of course.

The five cable car companies in the Skicircus have been following the path of energy saving, green electricity production and the reduction of fossil fuels for many years. With the following projects that have already been realised, many initial steps have already been taken towards a 'grandchild-friendly' footprint.

Ecological Piste management

After the slopes are closed at 05:00 pm, when 75 snow groomers turn the slopes of the Skicircus back into immaculate fine-ribbed pistes, environmentally friendly efficiency is the top priority.

This is possible thanks to the snow depth measurement system integrated into the snow groomers via GPS. During the grooming process, the snow depth is measured under the snow groomer and the operator can immediately see from the colours on the monitor where he still needs snow. The snow can be distributed or newly produced in a targeted manner and the labour required for grooming and snow production can be reduced by 20%.

With the SNOWsat LiDAR snow depth measurement, the next step is taken: for the first time, not only under the machine, but also 50 metres in front of and next to the machine are measured in real time thanks to laser measurement. This high-tech innovation is already in use on three machines, where it increases productivity while simultaneously reducing costs.

„Pistenwaseln“

Renaturalisation is the top priority for all earthmoving activities. In order to proceed with the minimum possible impact on nature when moving earth on the mountains, the so-called turf is lifted from the ground with an excavator, adjustments are made to the subsoil and the turf is then carefully put back in place. This process is called "Pistenwaseln".

Water cycle and reservoirs

The term "artificial snow" mistakenly triggers an association with chemicals. In fact, the entire technical snowmaking system in the Skicircus Saalbach Hinterglemm Leogang Fieberbrunn is fed from spring, rain, and meltwater and without the use of chemicals.

Water is not wasted during snow production, but only utilised: When the snow melts and through evaporation, 100% of the water is returned to nature. Reservoirs are created so that natural watercourses are not impacted by abstraction, especially in the winter months when runoff is low. High-lying reservoirs equalise the energy consumption peaks through pumping pressure. Comprehensive renaturalisation measures, such as the promotion of wildlife projects, reforestation, the conversion of forest areas worthy of protection and the preservation of protected areas, are being implemented for all reservoirs built. forest areas, preservation of areas worthy of protection such as ponds, moorland and biotopes, habitat improvement measures

for breeding grounds of protected bird species, etc. In addition, shallow areas for amphibians are included in the planning.

HVO100

With the first use of the renewable fuel HVO100 for some of the piste equipment and vehicle fleets in the 2023/24 winter season, those responsible at the mountain railways in Saalbach Hinterglemm Leogang Fieberbrunn have taken another important step towards reducing CO2 emissions.

HVO stands for 'Hydrotreated Vegetable Oil'. In addition to vegetable oils, waste and oils and fats from residual materials are also utilised, such as used cooking oil or frying fat from kitchens. The vegetable oil is purified, treated with hydrogen at high temperatures and thus made usable as a fuel.

As far as emissions are concerned, the use of the new fuel is a game changer, says Kornel Grundner, Managing Director of the Leoganger mountain railways. Compared to fossil diesel, it has been proven that up to 96 % of CO2 emissions can be saved. In addition, HVO100 also reduces local emissions - 33% less particulate matter, 9% less nitrogen oxide, 30% less hydrocarbons and 24% less carbon monoxide are released.

Fuel from plant power was also very important for the FIS Alpine World Ski Championships Saalbach 2025: the entire area on the Zwölferkogel was only be serviced by HVO-powered vehicles for the World Championships, says Peter Mitterer, Managing Director of Hinterglemm Bergbahnen. One of many building blocks that have made the 2025 World Championships a green event.

Power from sun, water & wind

Our mountains offer ideal conditions for alternative power generation, which is why those responsible in the Skicircus are increasingly focussing on generating electricity from hydro, solar and wind power. The new Wiesermühle power plant in Hinterglemm provides clean electricity from renewable resources since winter 2024. With a capacity of 430 kW and a forecast annual energy output of 1.8 gigawatt hours, this green electricity will be used by the cable car facilities, among others.

The entire Skicircus has been focussing on renewable energy from solar power for years. Photovoltaic systems on the roofs of cable car stations and operating buildings as well as PV panels in façades convert the many hours of sunshine into clean electricity.

Austrian Ecolabel for Saalfelden Leogang

Saalfelden Leogang is one of the first regions in Austria to be awarded the Austrian Ecolabel for destinations. The region is also involved with its memberships in respACT (Saalfelden Leogang was the first regional tourism organization), the Climate Alliance and the Salzburg Fair-bindet sustainability club (Saalfelden Leogang was the first tourism association in SalzburgerLand to join both).
